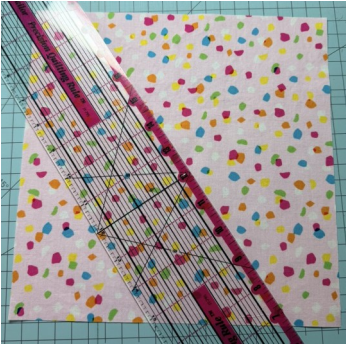


Wonky Fireworks Block



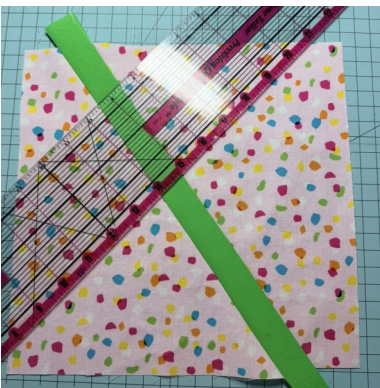
Using a 10 inch square of background fabric and one WOF strip cut to 1.5 inches wide (You can use anywhere from 1.25" to 2" strips)



Cut a diagonal line-
no specific position but DO NOT go through the exact corners.
DO NOT lose the orientation of your pieces.



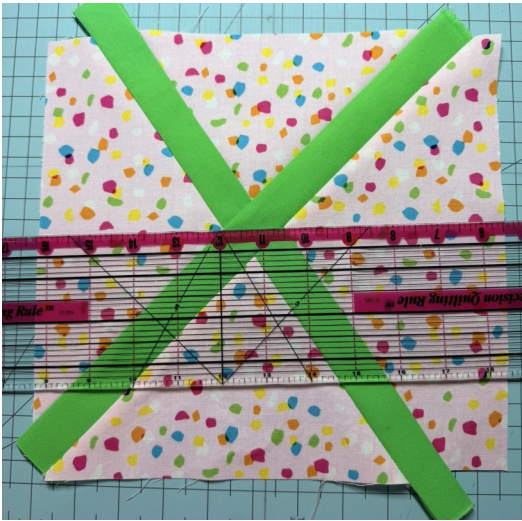
Sew your strip to one piece, press,
and then add the other half to that strip.
Press.



Make another diagonal cut in the opposite direction.
Again- DO NOT go through the exact corners.
DO NOT lose the orientation of your pieces.



Add the strip to the first half and press. Lay the pieces together to get an approximate matching of seams. Remember - its supposed to be WONKY so don't worry about being slightly off. Add that second half to the strip and press.



Now you will cut across the block, making sure to go through the center where the other two strips meet.

Add a third strip in the same way you have done the other two.



Match the centers as much as you wish before sewing that final seam.

But remember...WONKY!



TADAAA!- the final block.

You will need to trim the blocks up to all the same size when they are all done. So, NO TRIMMING until all blocks are complete so you know how small you need to go.

Wonky Hashtag Block



Starting with a 10 inch square of your background fabric and two strips. I used 1.5 inch by WOF.

Make two cuts from top to bottom, approximately dividing the block in thirds and remember to make them wonky!

DO NOT lose the orientation of your pieces!



Add strips in between each piece and sew the block back together.

Now make 2 cuts across the block, side to side, again dividing the block approximately in thirds- but WONKY!

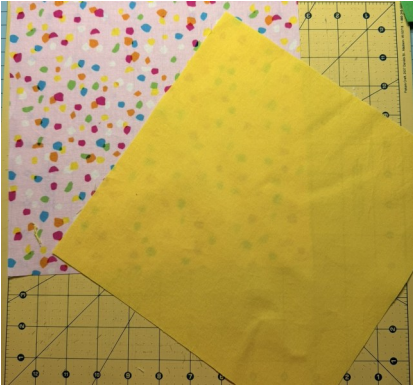


DO NOT lose the orientation of your pieces!

Add strips in between each piece and line the seams up as much as you want. Trim when all blocks are done.

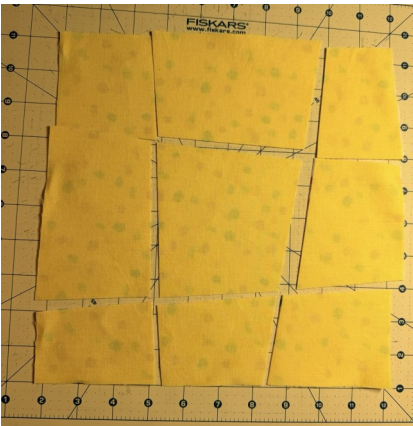


Wonky Nine Patch



Start with two 10 inch squares: one of background fabric and one of your main fabric.

Stack them on top of each other and you are going to cut a wonky hashtag into the blocks as in the second picture.



Then rearrange the pieces so that the fabrics alternate as in the third picture.

DO NOT lose the orientation of your blocks throughout- be really careful!



Sew the pieces together in rows, as in the fourth picture. Press. Then sew the rows together.

You will end up with two blocks that are the opposite of each other.

Trim once all your blocks are completed.
